The round, wooden cases on the plat-
form each contain a pair of millstones.

The miller controlled the coarseness of
the meal by setting a wheel which raised
or lowered the runner stone. The higher
the runner, the coarser the meal.

A portion
of the
meal
was
removed
by the
runner on the
flat
base side of
the
millstone.
The millings
produced a
white
original meal.

A screen
was
placed
above the
millstone. If
the meal
was too
coarse, it
could
be
removed.
The
millstone
was
then
raised
and
the
meal
was
ground
again.
