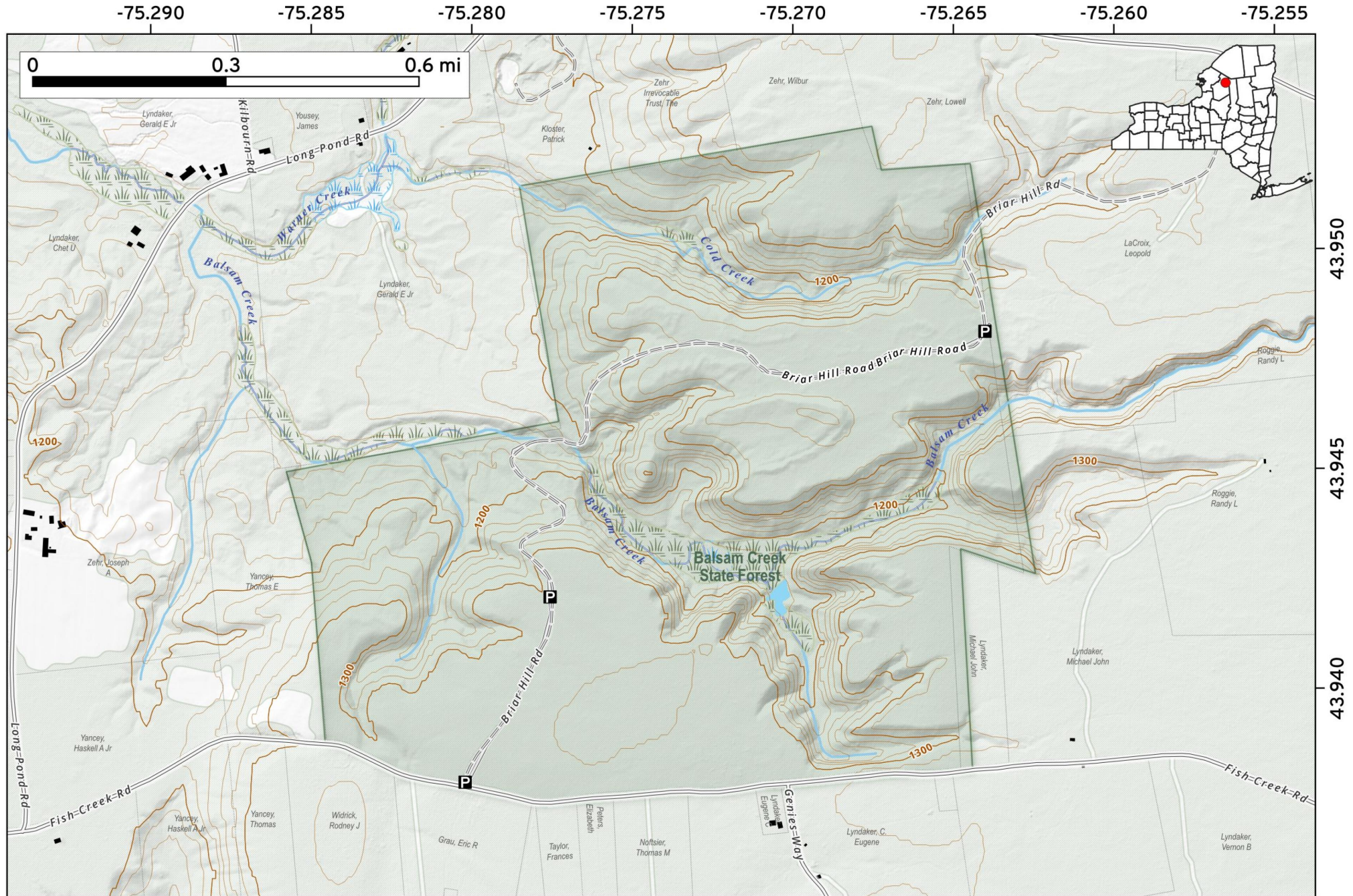

Onjebonge State Forest in Harrisville, New York, spans 1,825 acres of diverse terrain. Its granite-based soils support hardwood stands like maple and ash, alongside red and white pine plantations. Visitors enjoy hunting, primitive camping, and wildlife viewing amidst rolling landscapes and beaver-flooded wetlands.
